Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 58 counties of California from 1890 to 1930, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1930. Of these counties, 52 increased in population between 1920 and 1930, and 6 show decreases. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1920.
